Matter arising

Donald Hearn reported that the riverside colleges showed little enthusiasm for the suggestion that they undertook a survey of their drainage into the river. It was agreed to pursue this again in due course.

Report of steering group

The report was broadly accepted. The following points on the various sections were agreed:

1 Access rights and highways issues were added to the list.

3 Small streams with an EA ID number should be included, such as Hobson's Brook.

4 **All participants** agreed to add to Rob Mungovan's document. **Rob Mungovan** and **Peter Landshoff** were appointed to edit it, with advice from **Jean Perraton**.

The preferred date for the workshop is Saturday 28 September. It should run from 0930 to 1300, with participants encouraged to stay for lunch and take a tour or a punt trip in the afternoon.

The workshop will be invitation only, with selected organisations being invited to send one or two delegates. Landowners, riverside colleges, and the university were added to the list of organisations. The workshop should begin with briefing talks and the participants will then divide into breakout groups. **Carolyn Göhler**, **Lou Mayer**, **Richard Moseley** and **Pip Noon** were appointed to settle the details .

5 It was agreed to follow the format of the Bedford Waterspace Strategy.

Carolyn Göhler and **Camilla Haggett** will produce sample maps. In due course we will need a mapping sub-group.

It was agreed that it is important to get together the right up-to-date data sets.

6 At some stage it will be useful to seek advice from those concerned with Thames catchment work, particularly for the River Wandle.

8 A press release will be prepared when the workshop details have been settled.

9 **Jean Perraton**, with help from **Lou Mayer**, will make an application to the Catchment Partnership Fund.
