

Jobs

- 100,000 jobs in City
- 89,000 working age people (ONS) of whom
 9000 work outside Cambridge, 1200 in London (Centre for Cities)
- 5000 people commute to Cambridge area from Bury St Edmunds (Centre for Cities)
- Job claimant rate 1.9% (national average 4.1%)
 - lowest in the country (Centre for Cities)

Quality of life survey 2006


- 80% of Cambridgeshire residents happy with their neighbourhood
- But it was 86% three years previously

Main problems:

crime/vandalism litter/rubbish nuisance neighbours parking problems

Alcohol

- number of young people aged 11-15 who drink alcohol appears to have reduced, but
 - those who do consume alcohol are drinking more, and more often,
 - with higher levels of alcohol consumption being associated with a range of high-risk behaviours including unprotected sex and offending. (Cambs Alcohol Strategy)

Deprivation

- Cambridge: 10th lowest deprivation score out of 56 towns in the country
- <u>But</u> some areas of Wisbech are among the 10% most deprived in the country,
 - many people likely to have low educational attainment
 - receive a low income
 - have low life expectancy (Cambs CC)
- Wisbech 2020 Vision
