I am writing to tell you about your FIRST in the Mathematical Tripos Part II. The marks are presented in three lines at the bottom of this page. The first line gives your name and college followed by your total mark, α 's and β 's. The other figures show your marks, α 's and β 's for each of the letter sections A,B,C,D E and F,G,H,J,K of the examination, and the computational projects, on the third line. By referring to your examination papers you can work out which courses are marked under each letter head.

The minimum marks required for each class were

Class I: 320 marks and 14α 's Class II: 163 marks and 6α 's and 4β 's

There were 59 firsts, 112 seconds and 19 thirds. You came top of the entire year in total number of marks and α 's. This is the first time that I can remember this distinction being achieved by a Queens' mathematics student, and also the first time I can recall it having been achieved by a woman. I am really pleased by what you have done. It has been a pleasure to have you studying at Queens' during the past three years. Best wishes for the summer and into the future.
